The Minister of Finance, on behalf of the Government, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

- (2) CANE FARMERS REHABILITATION FUND BILL 1974 Bill No. 17/1974
 The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House, on behalf of the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of National Development and Agriculture, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:
 - A BILL intituled AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT FOR THE BENEFIT OF CANE FARMERS OF A FUND UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL CANE FARMING COMMITTEE AND FOR PURPOSES CONNECTED THEREWITH.

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly approve that the Minister responsible for finance may establish the Contingencies Fund by issues from the Consolidated Fund not exceeding in the aggregate an amount equivalent to two per cent of the estimated annual expenditure of the last preceding financial year as shown in the annual estimates of revenue and expenditure approved by the National Assembly with respect to that year.

The Leader of the Opposition spoke to the motion.

Thereafter the Minister of Finance replied.

The motion was then put and carried.
