Clause 1 be deleted and substitute for section 1 a new section 1 -

"The Principal Act is repealed and replaced by the Essential Services Act."

Clause 5

Delete the entire subsections 1(a) and 1(b) and insert the following subsections -

- (a) In the case of an employer to a fine of thirty thousand dollars and to imprisonment for two months or;
- (b) In the case of a Trade Union to a fine ten thousand dollars and to imprisonment for one month or;
- (c) If the offence is a continuing one, in the case of an Employer or Trade Union a further fine of \$1,000.00 and in the case of a worker a fine of \$200.00 for every day or part of a day during which the offence continues.

Insert the following proviso to section 19:

"Provided that no prosecution for such a contravention shall be instituted without the consent of the Director of Public Prosecutions."
