Will Government state for he years 1945 to 1951 inclusive the following, g ving figures for different countries separately:-

- (a) The non-sterling currency earned from the export of products from British Guiana.
- (b) The value of impo ts from non-sterling areas into British Guia a.

AND WHEREAS it has cr ated great hardship on tenants of lands of small holdings in this Colony;

AND WHEREAS justice would be met by an amendment of Section 46(2)(a) of Ordinance No. 26 of 1947 by the inclusion of the words coconut trees, fruit trees and permanent crops.

BE IT RESOLVED that t is Council recommends to Government the amendment of Section 46(2)(a) of Ordinance No. 26 of 1947 to provide for growing crops to include coccnut tees, fruit trees and permanent crops from which the tenant can be awarded damages and compensation by the Magistrate on being dispossessed of his holdin's as a tenant.

AND WHEREAS recent floodings have shown how seriously the population cin be affected;

BE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable Council recommend to Government the establishment of a Government controlled insurance for farmers in the Colony against loss of cattle and crops from floods, droughts and other causes and that a Committee be appointed to go into the matter and report thereon.
