IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER BY SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ACT, I HEREBY ORDER AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order which amends the Trade (Control of Citation. Prices) Order* may be cited as the Trade (Control of Prices) (Amendment) (No. 74) Order 1974.

2. The Principal Order is hereby amended —

- (c) by the substitution for the figures "30" appearing in the second column of Part A and B, respectively, of the Fourth Schedule thereto in relation to the article numbered 36(d)(iii) (Tomato Ketchup) of the figures "28".
