REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE APPLIANCES TO BE FITTED TO BICYCLES AND TRICYCLES FOR ENSURING THAT RIDERS OF SUCH VEHICLES SHALL GIVE AUDIBLE AND SUFFICIENT WARNING OF THEIR APPROACH.

Warning to be given by approaching cyclists.

1. Every person riding or being upon any bicycle or tricycle and overtaking any bicycle, tricycle or any foot passenger being on or proceeding along any public way shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing the same, by sounding a bell, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach.

Date of coming into operation.

2. These Regulations shall come into force on 1st January, 1938.
