THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ORDINANCE, 1957, (No. 3 of 1957).

UNDER SECTION 112 OF THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ORDINANCE, 1957, THE FOLLOWING REGULA-TIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUN-CIL:-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Representation of short title, the People Regulations, 1957.
- 2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise re-Interpretaquires-

"elector" includes a person voting as proxy for an elector; "the Ordinance" means the Representation of the People Ordinance, 1957;

"schedule" means a schedule to these Regulations.

4. (1) Except for the purpose of delivering a nomination paper Right to ator of assisting the returning officer, no person shall be entitled to ation. attend the proceedings during the time for delivery of nomination papers unless he is a person standing nominated as a candidate or is the election agent, the agent authorized in pursuance of section 18 of the Ordinance, the proposer or the seconder of such a person:

Provided that where a candidate acts as his own election agent he may name one other person who shall be entitled to attend in

place of his election agent.

(2) Where a person stands nominated by more than one nomination paper only the person subscribing, as proposer and seconder, such one of the nomination papers as he may select or, in the absence of such selection, the paper which is first delivered, shall be entitled to attend as his proposer and seconder.

(3) The returning officer shall at the request of any elector supply him with a form of nomination paper at the place and during the time for delivery of nomination papers and shall at the request of any such elector prepare a nomination paper for signature, but it shall not be necessary for a nomination to be on a form supplied by the returning officer.

(4) The description of the candidate appearing on the nomination paper shall not refer to the candidate's political activities.

5. (1) The list of the names of the candidates duly nominated Publication required to be prepared by section 17 of the Ordinance shall show of nominations. the names, addresses and occupations of the persons nominated as given in their nomination papers, together with the names of their proposers and the seconder.

(2) The list shall show the names of the candidates duly nominated arranged alphabetically in the order of their surnames



and where there are two or more of them with the same surname. of their other names. Opposite the name of each candidate shall be given a description of the symbol allocated to him.

- 6. (1) The returning officer shall in the list of candidates duly nominated include a notice of the poll, stating the day on which and the hours during which the poll will be taken.
- (2) As soon as possible after nomination day the returning officer shall give public notice of the situation of each polling-place and shall in such notice describe by electoral district, polling division and polling area the electors entitled to vote thereat. notice shall indicate the polling-place appointed to be the head polling-place of the electoral district.

7. The notice of the withdrawal of a candidate required to be Form No. 2 delivered by a returning officer under section 23(3) of the Ordinance shall be in the form set out as Form No. 2 of the first schedule

Appointment of proxy.

9. (1) Every application for the appointment of a proxy shall reach the returning officer not later than the tenth day before polling day and if received after that day shall be disregarded.

(2) Every application for the appointment of a proxy shall be accompanied by a statement, in the form set out as Form No. 3 of the first schedule, by the person named therein as proxy that he consents to his appointment as such.

- (3) Every application for the appointment of a proxy on account of an elector's blindness or other physical incapacity shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by a registered medical practitioner to the effect that his blindnes or other physical incapacity is such that he is unable or likely to be unable to go in person to his polling-place on the day of the poll, or if able to go, to vote unaided.
- (4) As soon as may be after issue of a proxy paper the returning officer shall notify the applicant thereof.
- (5) If a returning officer does not issue a proxy paper in pursuance of an application made to him for the appointment of a proxy, he shall notify the applicant of his reason for not so doing.

(6) Where the appointment of a proxy is cancelled by notice given to the returning officer, the returning officer shall forthwith remove his name from the list of proxies.

(7) A notice cancelling the appointment of a proxy shall be disregarded if it is received by the returning officer on or after the tenth day before polling day.

(8) The list of proxies to be kept by the returning officer shall be in the form set out as Form No. 4 in the first schedule,

10.(1) The returning officer shall take measures before the commencement of the taking of the poll to ensure that every polling place is properly numbered and adequately designated and provided with proper doors, barriers, tables, chairs and other conveniences, and that the same are properly arranged for carrying cut the purposes of the Ordinance and of these Regulations.

Preparation of pollingplaces.

(2) The returning officer or his election clerk shall on or before the day fixed for the taking of the poll and before the commencement of the taking thereof, if convenient for him so to do, visit every polling- place and see that every polling-place is provided with doors, barriers, tables, chairs and conveniences as aforesaid.

11.(1) The returning officer shall provide each polling-place with such number of compartments as may be necessary in which the electors can mark their votes screened from observation.

(2) Nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to require that a polling compartment shall wholly enlose the elector.

12. There shall be printed on every ballot paper opposite to the names of each candidate one of the symbols shown in the appendix to these Regulations. The order in which such symbols are allocated to candidates shall correspond with the order in which the names of the candidates appear on the list of persons nominated prepared in accordance with section 17 of the Ordinance and regulations.

13. For the guidance of electors the Chief Electoral Officer shall cause notices to be printed in conspicuous characters (English, Urdu and Nagri) in the form set out as Form No. 5 in the first schedule.

14.(1) The returning officer shall supply every presiding officer

(b) a statement showing the number of ballot papers and tendered ballot papers so supplied, with their serial numbers:

(c) the necessary materials for electors to mark their

(d) at least three copies of printed directions for voting in the form referred to in regulation 13 for the guidance of electors in voting;

(e) copies of or excerpts from the Ordinance and these

Regulations:

(f) at least three copies of the official list of electors or such part thereof as contains the names of the electors entitled to vote at the polling-place at which he is appointed to preside, certified under the hand of the returning officer;

(g) a ballot box, and materials for affixing thereto or stamping thereon the presiding officer's seal;

(h) a poll book and a sufficient number of poll cards;

(1) the several forms of oaths to be administered to electors printed together on a card; and

(j) the necessary envelopes and such other forms and supplies as may be authorised or furnished by the Chief Electoral Officer.

(2) The ballot box shall be of convenient size, and shall be so constructed that the ballot papers can be put therein, but cannot be

withdrawn therefrom, without the box being unlocked.

(3) Until the opening of the poll the presiding officer shall keep the ballot papers, the official lists of electors, the poll book and poll cards, the forms of oaths, envelopes and other election supplies carefully locked up, using the ballot box for this purpose if it is practicable to do so, and shall take every precaution for their safe keeping and to prevent any person having unlawful access to them.

(4) Before the hours fixed for the opening of the poll the presiding officer shall post up in a conspicuous position outside the polling-place a copy of the directions for voting referred to in

paragraph (d) of subregulation (1) of this regulation.

Election agent, pollagent, polling agent and counting form set out as Form No. 6 in the first schedule.

(2) An election agent may appoint one polling agent to attend at each polling-place, and may appoint one of the polling agents (hereinafter referred to as a counting agent) to attend at the count-

ing of votes at the head polling-place.

(3) Not less than three clear days before polling day the election agent shall give notice in writing to the returning officer in the form set out as Form No. 7 in the first schedule, of the name and address of every polling agent and of the counting agent so appointed, and the returning officer shall thereupon forthwith give public notice of the name and address of every polling agent and every counting agent so declared by causing placards to be affixed in a conspicuous position, on such polling places, court-houses, post offices and police stations in the electoral district as the returning officer may deem necessary.

(4) If a polling or counting agent dies, or becomes incapable of acting, the election agent may appoint another agent in his place, and shall forthwith give to the returning officer (or where that is not practicable, to the appropriate presiding officer) notice in writing of the name and address of the agent so appointed.

(5) Any notice required to be given to a counting agent by the returning officer may be delivered at or sent by post to the address stated in the notice of appointment.

(6) A candidate may himself do any act or thing which any polling or counting agent of his, if appointed, would have been authorised to do, or may assist his agent in doing any such act or thing.

(7) Where by these regulations any act or thing is required or authorised to be done in the presence of the polling or counting agents, the non-attendance of any agents or agent at the time and place appointed for the purpose, shall not, if the act or thing is otherwise duly done, invalidate the act or thing done.

Form No. 7 First schedule. 16.(1) The presiding officer shall regulate the number of electors to be admitted to the polling-place at the same time and shall, subject to sub-regulation (2) of this regulation, exclude all other persons except —

Admission to pollingplace.

(a) the candidates and their election agents;

(b) the polling agents appointed to attend at the polling-place;

(c) the assistant presiding officer and poll clerks appointed to attend at the polling-place;

(d) the members of the police force on duty; and

(e) the friends of blind or otherwise incapacitated electors:

(2) The Commissioner of Elections, the Chief Electoral Officer and the returning officer and elections clerk of the electoral district shall be admitted to any polling-place in the electoral district at any time.

(3) The candidates or their agents in a polling-place shall be posted in such a place that they can see each person who presents himself as an elector and interfere in the proceedings to the extent allowed by the Ordinance and these Regulations, but so that they cannot see how any elector votes or otherwise interfere in the proceedings.

17. Immediately before the commencement of the poll the presiding officer shall, after locking the ballot box as directed by section 36(1) of the Ordinance, place his seal on it in such manner

as to prevent its being opened without breaking the seal.

18. (1) Each elector upon entering the polling-place shall state to the poll clerk his name, occupation, place of residence and postal address (as they appear on the official list of electors).

(2) Every person voting as proxy for an elector shall state to the poll clerk his name and address and the name, occupation, place of residence and postal address of the elector on whose behalf he is appointed to vote as proxy (as they appear on the official list of electors).

(3) When the poll clerk has ascertained that the name of the elector appears on the official list of electors for the polling-place he shall write on a card (in these Regulations referred to as a "poll card") the number of the elector on the said official list of electors and the poll card shall be given to the elector or proxy as the case may be.

(4) The poll card shall be in the form set out as Form No. 8

in the first schedule.

(5) Each person on coming to vote shall deliver the poll card

to the presiding officer or assistant presiding officer.

(6) The presiding officer of a polling-place situate in any electoral district, polling division or group of polling divisions specified in the second schedule shall include in his ballot paper account a statement certified under his hand of the number of poll cards issued to—

(a) electors whose names are not on the official list of electors for the polling division in which the polling-place is situate; and

(b) electors whose names are not on the official list of electors for the polling area in which the pollingplace is situate.

(7) The statement referred to in the preceding subregulation shall not include the number of poll cards issued to electors whose names have been transferred under the provisions of section 29 of the Ordinance.

Duty of presiding officer on close of the poll.

19.(1) As soon as practicable after the close of the poll, the presiding officer shall, in the presence of such candidates and agents as may be in attendance, make up into separate packets, properly labelled and sealed with his own seal and the seals of those candidates or their agents who desire to affix their seals -

(a) each ballot box in use at the polling-place, sealed so as to prevent the introduction of additional ballot papers and unopened, but with the key attached;

(b) the unused and spoiled ballot papers placed together:

(c) the tendered ballot papers;

(d) the counterfoils of the used and spoiled ballot papers and of the tendered ballot papers;

(e) the marked copies of the official list of electors;

(f) the proxy papers surrendered to the presiding officer:

(g) the poll book and used and unused poll cards, and shall with all convenient speed deliver the packets to the returning officer.

(2) The counterfoils of the used and spoiled ballot papers and of the tendered ballot papers shall on no account be kept in the same packet with any other election document or material.

(3) The packets shall be accompanied by —

(a) a statement (in these Regulations referred to as "the ballot paper account") made by the presiding officer showing the number of ballot papers entrusted to him, and accounting for them under the heads of ballot papers in the ballot box, unused, spoiled and tendered ballot papers;

(b) in the case of a polling-place situate in any electoral district, any polling division or any group of polling divisions specified in the second schedule, the statemnet prepared in accordance with sub-

regulation (6) of regulation 18.

(4) If any presiding officer shall omit to carry out any of the requirements of this regulation he shall, in addition to any other punishment to which he may be liable, forfeit all right to

payment for his services as such officer.

Atttendance of votes.

20. (1) The returning officer shall make arrangements for at counting counting the votes in the presence of the counting agents as soon as practicable after the close of the poll, and shall give to the counting agents notice of the time and place at which he will begin to count the votes.

(2) No person other than—

- (a) the returning officer, and such other election officers as he may appoint to assist him in the counting;
 - (b) the candidates and their wives or husbands;
 - (c) the election agents; and
- (d) the counting agents,

may be present at the counting of the votes, unless permitted by

the returning officer to attend.

(3) The returning officer shall give the counting agents all such reasonable facilities for overseeing the proceedings, and all such information with respect thereto, as he can give them consistently with the orderly conduct of the proceedings and the discharge of his duties in connection therewith.

21. The returning officer shall endorse the word "rejected" on any ballot paper which he may reject as invalid, and shall add to the endorsement the words "rejection objected to" if any objection be in fact made by a candidate or his agent to the decision.

22. (1) Together with, or as soon as may be after, the return of the writ to the Governor as directed by section 44 of the Ordinance, the returning officer shall make a return to the Chief Electoral Officer, showing, in relation to each polling-place —

(a) the number of persons who appear to have voted;

(b) the number of spoiled ballot papers delivered to him:

(c) the number of persons to whom from the counterfoils, ballot papers appear to have been supplied;

(d) the number of votes counted by him given to each candidate; and

(e) the number of ballot papers rejected and not counted by him under the several heads.

(2) The return to the Chief Electoral Officer shall be in the form prescribed by the Chief Electoral Officer and shall be forwarded in triplicate to him, and be published in the Gazette in any summarized form deemed suitable by him.

23. Not later than seven days after the return to the writ the returning officer shall forward to the Chief Electoral Officer a report of the proceedings in the form prescribed by the Chief Electoral Officer.

24.(1) The election expenses returns, referred to in subsection (1) of section 55 of the Ordinance, shall be in the form set out as Form No. 9 of the first schedule.

(2) The election expenses declarations referred to in subsections (3), (4), (5) and (8) of section 55 of the Ordinance, shall be in the form set out as Form No. 10 of the first schedule.

25. Any person shall be entitled to obtain from the Clerk of the Legislature a certified copy of any statutory declaration of qualification deposited with him under section 18 of the Ordinance on payment of a copying fee of twelve cents for every one hundred and twenty words or part thereof.

26. The Oath of Qualification set out as Form No. 12 in the first schedule to the Ordinance is hereby varied —

(a) by the deletion of paragraph (1) and the substitution therefor of the following —

DIRECTIONS FOR VOTING.

- (1) You can vote for only one candidate at this Election.
- (2) You should see that the ballot paper, before it is handed to you, has the presiding officer's initials written on the back.
- (3) You are to go into one of the compartments and there place a cross within the blank space opposite the name and symbol of the candidate for whom you wish to vote. You are to make the cross like this: X.
- (4) When you have marked your vote, fold up your bailot paper so as to conceal your vote but so as to show the numbers and the presiding officer's initials at the back. Then show the officer presiding those numbers and initials, put your ballot paper in the ballot box and leave the polling-place.
- (5) If you accidentally spoil your ballot paper you may return it to the presiding officer who on being satisfied of the fact will give you another.
- (6) If you vote for more than one candidate or place any mark on the ballot paper by which you can afterwards be identified your vote will be void and will not be counted.
