EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to give legal effect to the Revised Treaty of Chaguaramas establishing the Caribbean Community including the Caricom Single Market and Economy signed in the Bahamas on the 5th day of July, 2001.

The Revised Treaty of two hundred and eighty-eight (288) pages shall have the force of law in Guyana. The Caribbean Community shall have full juridical personality. (Clause 3 of the Bill)

Sums to be paid by the Government under the Revised Treaty shall be charged on, and sums received under the Treaty shall be paid into the Consolidated Fund. (Clause 4)

The Minister responsible for Caricom Affairs may make provision for implementing any community obligation of Guyana under the Treaty. (Clause 5)

In any legal proceedings a question concerning the interpretation or application of the Treaty shall be treated as a question of law to be referred to the Caribbean Court of Justice, where a court seised of an issue considers that a decision on the question is necessary for it to deliver judgment. (Clause 6) any existing law, other than the Constitution, to bring that (Clause 6).

Where the Treaty is amended in accordance with Article 236, the Minister responsible for Caricom Affairs shall, by order, amend the Treaty accordingly. (Clause 7)
