(ii) Repairs to Parliament Chamber

The Speaker made the following statement:

"Honourable Members, before the adjournment of the last sitting on 5th August, 2004, I announced that sittings of the Assembly would have resumed in the Parliament Chamber after this year's recess. Unfortunately, the Parliament Office underestimated the volume of repairs to be carried out to the areas adjoining the Parliament Chamber.

Upon commencement of the repairs, it was discovered that almost all of the massive floor beams, uprights and rafters were rotten, doubling the estimated cost and duration of the repairs.

Honourable Members, as you are aware, the Public Buildings was constructed in 1832, and my information is, that since its construction, no significant repairs were carried out to the roof, walls and the floor. Because of the condition of the areas presently under repairs, I have instructed the Clerk to budget to restore the wooden structure of the Buildings over the next three (3) years.

The repairs to the Chamber have ben completed and the surrounding areas are now being renovated to accommodate a large Committee/Conference Room, a new location for the Speaker's Office, an office for the Prime Minister, an office for the Leader of the Opposition, two offices for Parliamentary Committees and a computer centre to be used by Members of Parliament.

Repairs will also commence shortly on the area that was formally occupied by the Public Utilities

Commission to accommodate a second Committee Room and offices for staff of the Parliament Office.

I do regret my hastly conclusion which I announced at the end of the last sitting and to ask that you bear with us for a while. I am aware that Members are anxious for the sittings to resume at the Chamber. It is near completion and I hope that we will resume sittings in our regular location shortly."

(iii) Establishment of a Resource Centre

The Speaker informed the Assembly that the U.N.D.P. had refurbished a room in the South-Eastern corner of the Public Buildings at a cost of US\$4,000 and had since established a Resource Centre therein. The Centre is accommodating nine (9) computers with accessories at a cost of US\$21,000 and that the purpose of the Resource Centre is to support the work of the four Parliamentary Sectoral Committees. He said that the Government of Guyana had contributed to this project by the appointment of an Information Technology Officer.

(iv) Fiscal and Financial Management Program

The Speaker made the following announcement:-

"The Government of Guyana and the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) have set aside, as part of a Fiscal and Financial Management Programme, a sum of US\$665,000 for the National Assembly to support the operations of the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) and the Economic Services Committee (ESC) over a three year period. US\$65,000 of this amount would be counter part financing. The activities which are to be funded and their associated costs are as follows:-

(v) Deputy Clerk of the National Assembly - Attendance at Training Programme in India

The Speaker announced that Mrs. Lilawtie Coonjah, Deputy Clerk of the National Assembly was attending a seven (7) week intensive Parliamentary Internship Training Programme at the Bureau of Parliamentary Studies and Training at the Lok Sabha Secretariat in New Delhi, India. The Programme commenced on 6th October and will end on 25th November, 2004.

He informed the Assembly that during Mrs. Coonjah's absence, Mr. Rawle Small, Chief Administrative Officer, would be performing the duties of Deputy Clerk of the National Assembly.
