Assembly resumed.

Recommittal of Bill

On a motion by the Senior Minister of Health, the Bill was recommitted to consider Clause 36.

On a motion by the Senior Minister of Health, Clause 36 was deleted and Clause 37 was renumbered as Clause 36.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Senior Minister of Health, the Bill was read the third time and <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u>.

- (ii) The word "quantity" was substituted for the word "value" in the First Schedule.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Senior Minister of Agriculture, the Bill was read the third time and passed as amended.
