ORDER IN COUNCIL

THE JUDGMENTS EXTENSION ORDINANCE,

THE JUDGMEN IS EXTENSION ORDINAL

(Chapter 27)

WHEREAS by the Judgments Extension Ordinance, 1922, it is amongst other things provided that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal arrangements have been made by the legislature of any part of Her Majesty's dominions outside of the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of Her Majesty's dominions of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of British Guiana, the Governor may, by order in council, declare that this Ordinance shall extend to judgments obtained in a superior court in that part of Her Majesty's dominions in the like manner as it extends to judgements obtained in a superior court in the United Kingdom, and on any such order being made, the said Ordinance shall extend accordingly;

AND WHEREAS the Governor is satisfied that the legislature of the Federation of Nigeria being part of Her Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within those parts of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of British Guiana:

NOW THEREFORE, the Governor by virtue and in the exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Ordinance and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, to order and declare that the Judgments Extension Ordinance shall extend to judgments obtained in the courts set out in the schedule hereto in the like manner as it extends to judgments obtained in a superior court in the United Kingdom.
